

Requirement assistance sheet for Dual Sprints 2023

Requirements for all vehicles

- Car needs to have current wof and rego or a MSNZ log book -(available through Motorsport NZ about \$35). (1)
- A 0.9kg fire extinguisher mounted in the vehicle with 2 metal straps. (1)

Drivers of standard road cars need:

- Race helmet that meets the standards (see next page for details of the standards). (1)
- Minimum single layer race suit with under garments. (1)
- Under garments need to be either cotton or merino or flame retardant material eg.nomex to be worn under single layer race suit. (1)
- Where a multi layer race suit is worn under garments are not a mandatory requirement. (1)
- Socks need to be a minimum of cotton or wool. (1)
- Shoes need to be a minimum of leather. (1)
- For standard car foam neck brace (with a standard lap belt). (2)

Drivers of modified vehicles (roll cage, 4 point harness ect) need:

- Race helmet that meets the standards (see next page for details of the standards). (1)
- Minimum single layer race suit with under garments. (1)
- Under garments need to be either cotton or merino or flame retardant material eg.nomex to be worn under single layer race suit. (1)
- Where a multi layer race suit is worn under garments are not a mandatory requirement. (1)
- Socks need to be a minimum of cotton or wool. (1)
- Shoes need to be fire retardant. (1)
- For car with 4point or more harness FHR (2)
- Fire retardant gloves (2)

Recommendations:

1. Helmets should be replaced at least every seven(7) years, and
2. Helmets (when not in use) should be kept in helmet bags, and
3. In the case of a severe impact the helmet should be destroyed, and
4. Foam neck braces may be used for the purpose of driver comfort, providing they are made entirely of fire resistant material.
